Upcoming Fundraisers






STAR AWARD

PATHWAYS TO HIGH SCHOOL - CONTINUATION OF ITALIAN EDUCATION FOR EX-YPS STUDENTS FROM THE BILINGUAL STREAM

The P&C made a submission to the ACT Government's Education Legislation Reform program (https://www.education.act.gov.au/about-us/all-news-and-news-alerts/news-items/april-2023/have-yoursay-education-legislation-reform) regarding options for continuing Italian language education in High School for ex-YPS students. The P&C's submission made comments on two key aspects of the Discussion Paper on Enrolments and Attendance which addressed the challenges confronting YPS students who wish to continue learning the Italian language in High School and potential solutions.

Noting the interest in this issue from the YPS community, the P&C will provide future updates as we become aware of them. Now that the consultation phase has closed, the Bill will be drafted in the second half of 2023, to take effect for the 2025 school year.

Year One Learning Snapshots

Term 2, weeks 7-8, Helen Del Guzzo and Jess McGarrity


In classes Corallo and Magenta, we have continued to work on writing Narratives. We have been looking at the four important elements that constitute a narrative - characters, setting, problem and resolution - and have been identifying these elements in a variety of fairy stories.

In Mathematics, we have been continuing to explore numbers, including odd and even numbers. Our excursion to The Mint was very exciting - we learned a bunch of new facts about Australian coins (such as why the 50c coin has a dodecagon shape - ask the kids!!) and we saw the coin-making robots in action. The students then had lunch out on the grass, enjoyed chasing each other around, and were very respectful on our bus trip.

We have also been busy learning about the purpose and significance of Reconciliation Week, involving rich discussions about how each of us can contribute towards reconciliation, and a host of intricate artworks.

Congratulations to all students continuing to read frequently at home - your progress is evident!

Physical Science: Push and Pull

Year 2 students have started to investigate push and pull forces on the ground, in water and in the air.

Even though we cannot see or touch these forces, we can identify their effects: They can make things move, change direction or stop.

Push and pull forces are at work everywhere: Where can you find push and pull forces at home?









Maps, Directions, Cardinal points

Sara, our pre-service teacher from Bergamo, organised some engaging lessons around mapping.

The feedback from all year 2 students was very positive. They enjoyed being involved in a treasure hunt, learning about cardinal points, giving and following directions to get around Australia, and playing games to expand their Italian vocabulary.













Excursion - Royal Australian Mint

On Friday, classes Giada and Smeraldo had the opportunity to visit the Royal Australian Mint as part of their maths unit on Australian coins.

Students learnt about the value of the different coins and some key identifying features. The students were very interested in how the coins were made and enjoyed creating their own special \$1 coin.

Year 3 - 4 Update

Sizzling Starts!
In English we have been using exciting prompts to write sizzling starts to stories. The students are creating engaging and suspenseful beginnings and are loving sharing them.

In Indaco and Acqua have written
Sizzling Starts inspired by the Jackie
French book FIRE!

Some amazing examples of sizzling starts have been shared in the next column. We think you'll agree they're on FIRE!!!

In science in year 4 we are exploring forces of Friction, Gravity and Magnetism. We experimented with objects around the classroom to deepen our understanding of forces.






We have been discussing volume and capacity in Mathematics. We were very precise in measuring many different containers and feeling how heavy they were. Then we had water fun estimating how much a container could hold and then measuring for accuracy.

We are great estimators!!



Oro and Ambra have been writing descriptive paragraphs in Italian. Students have written a long descriptive paragraph about their Maestre! Their Italian teacher is very proud! :)



Oro and Ambra have been learning about different types of data representations.
Students have collected specific data in their class and had a lot of fun!

5/6 students have been learning about emotions and emotional intensity this term in Health. Students in Ambra and Oro acted out emotions including 'agitated, excluded, and angry.' This unit of work helps students to identify, label and use strategies to work through their emotions.



Gialla has been working hard on their elements of art posters for art.

Our health lessons have focused on worry thoughts and how to manage them.

Students have been learning about note-taking to support them when constructing paragraphs.



Supporting parents in responding to their child's strong emotions presentation

The School Psychology Service Early Intervention team are providing two parent presentations in term 3 that are aimed at supporting parents in responding to their child's strong emotions. During these presentations parents/carers will learn strategies to take positive action to address their child's challenging behaviours, learn skills to de-escalate conflict, and learn how to make positive changes in their family's dynamics.

Sessions will be held on Wednesday, August 23 and Wednesday, September 13, 2023 from 1:00pm – 2:00pm at Headley Beare Center for Teaching and Learning.
