School Review

Over the coming weeks I will be sharing feedback from our school review process. Please read the commendations that the school received:

- The positive relationships within the community of staff, students and parents is reinforced by the strong sense of belonging. Parents said, "there is a real sense of inclusion". Students said, "teachers are helpful, supportive and considerate of my way of working." Another student said, "teachers make learning fun."
- There is a strong sense of cultural inclusivity within the school community. The Italian heritage and culture are embedded and celebrated.
- The school is working actively to ensure qualified teachers are recruited to maintain the bilingual approach to schooling.
- All staff demonstrate a strong commitment to improving the outcomes of all students.
- The school has a strong partnership with the local community of Scanzorosciate, Bergamo to provide authentic learning experiences for its students.
- The school also has strong partnerships with parents and the wider community. Parents, students and staff described a strong sense of community in this school.
- The Montessori program provides an engaging student-centred curriculum designed to meet the needs of the whole child. Teachers in the primary school identified student strengths of learner readiness, respectful relationships, and self-regulation in those who have transitioned from the program into their classes.

Yarralumla Sportsground Pavilion Upgrade

The Yarralumla Sportsground pavilion located at the Yarralumla playing fields off Mueller st, has been programmed for refurbishment under the Sport and Recreation Facilities improvement program 2019/20. This program is an ongoing exercise that updates older assets helping to extend the life of our aging assets. Upgrade works consider the following items: roof (incl. sheeting, lining, downpipes, etc), internal and external lighting, ceiling, walls, doors and floors (incl. painting, etc), and toilets, showers, basins and fixings. It is anticipated that works will commence in mid-September 2019 and run for a period of eight weeks.





Year two have had a fun filled term so far exploring our semester theme 'Innovation'. We have been focusing on inventions that have shaped and transformed our world and our everyday lives in the past and present. In Science, we have been exploring 'push and pull' forces in everyday life and with toys from the past and present.

In English literacy, we have been exploring information texts with a particular focus on headings, subheadings and elaborating on information found. Perhaps you could enjoy reading some information texts with your child at home?

The students have been brushing up on their tennis skills at our local Yarralumla tennis courts on a weekly basis. This has been a five-week program focusing on forehand and backhand skills.

The ACT Education Directorate is hosting a ThinkUKnow presentation for parents, carers and teachers.

ThinkUKnow is a free, evidence-based cyber safety program by the Australian Federal Police. The presentation aims to provide you with the tools to create a safer online environment for young people in your care.

The presentation covers topics such as social media reputation management, cyberbullying, 'sexting', online grooming, online gaming, inappropriate content, privacy management, identity theft, how to protect your devices, and how to report matters when things go wrong.

The program bridges the knowledge gap between adults and young people so that everyone has an understanding of the roles they play and what they can do if something goes wrong online.

What young people SEE online

- We talk about challenges such as online grooming, 'sexting', cyberbullying and inappropriate content.
- What you can do to support young people through online challenges.
- We also explain how to report if something goes wrong.

What young people SAY online

- What you can do to help support young people understand what they say online can be permanent. We call this our 'digital shadow'.
- This includes talking about being respectful online, thinking before you post, knowing what information is okay to share online.

What young people DO online

- How they use technology to have fun online, such as applications (or apps), websites and social networks.
- How they can handle their digital shadow, including their privacy and relationships online.

Capital Football October Holiday Clinic

Hello,

My name is Brandon Stroud and I am the Game Development Coordinator for Capital Football. I am in charge of setting up School holiday clinics and we have one coming up on the 9th - 11th of October at the Hawker Football Centre.

The clinics are for new and existing players aged 4-11. We believe the best way to learn football is by playing football and our curriculum is designed to cater to all skill levels. Our qualified coaches are there to guide players through fun and football relevant activities and games, which are stimulating and challenging for all involved.

WHAT TO BRING

Players are advised to bring a hat, full drink bottle, football boots, shin pads, healthy lunch and snacks to fuel them throughout the day, and to wear weather appropriate clothing. Football boots are not compulsory and players are welcome to wear joggers. Shin pads are compulsory for safety.

Please be aware that players attending the clinics may have allergies (e.g. nut) and we ask that you consider this when packing your child's food. We also have a no sharing food policy.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Basic first aid and sunscreen will be available to participants throughout the clinic, as will a drink station/taps for players to fill up their drink bottles. Mandatory breaks are scheduled throughout the day for players to eat, re-apply sunscreen and stay hydrated.

Participants who require medication will also need to provide the clinic director with an action plan and show that required medication has been packed each day/where it is kept in the bag. Alternatively you can leave it with the clinic director each morning when you sign in.

The program runs from 9am to 12pm each day, Parents/Guardians MUST sign their child/children in and out each day. If someone other than a parent is doing the pick up and drop off please notify the clinic director in writing.

PROGRAM FEES

\$175 per 9 hour clinic for all participants.

Family Discount of 10% is available when registering more than one sibling per clinic.

Daily rates available upon request

All participants will receive a Canberra United Participation pack and Aldi Miniroos Certificate as well as an exclusive Canberra United Kids Club Membership which gives your child access to all Canberra United home games and a chance to high five the players in the tunnel after their warm up.

Wet weather policy

Please note that in the case of field closures Capital Football are not notified until 8:45am at the earliest. If grounds are closed staff will notify registered participants ASAP and will do their best to find an alternate venue.

Clinics go ahead in the rain, unless there is excessive rain predicted, thunder, lightning, hail or grounds become unsafe.
