#### **Online Assembly**


#### Satisfaction Survey results – Students.

## **PBL** (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

We have had a smooth start to the year with Positive Behaviour for Learning lessons taking place regularly in every classroom. Our school STAR values sit at the core of all our classroom and playground management and because we always couch terms positively, we are teaching our students what TO do rather than what NOT TO do. It changes the whole dynamic.

S = Safe. We teach our students how to be safe in the classroom and on the playground. For example, in the sandpit we keep the sand down below knees.

T = Team player. We teach our students to share resources; to take turns; to wait patiently. For example, in class we try to have the students put their hands up and wait rather than getting up to follow the teacher around.

A = Active Learner. We teach our students how to be a self-manager in the classroom rather than depending on the teacher to do things for them. We support them to question appropriately and be inquisitive learners.

R = Respectful. We teach our students to show respect for themselves and for others by using positive selftalk and by using kindness at the core of all interactions.

I will talk more about how we are changing the language to always be positive over the coming weeks.

#### **Data from PBL**

ESTARS: so far this year 15 students have been acknowledged with a 50 eSTAR award and 9 students have reached to 100 eSTAR milestone. These are awarded to students for showing the STAR values in class and on the playground. They can be awarded as individual or whole class acknowledgements.

So far in 2022 we have had the following ESTARS awarded:

Safe: 201 Team Player: 230 Active Learner: 535 Respectful: 483

Our system also records negative incidents. A minor negative incident is recorded for things like work refusal; inappropriate language; disruption and a major incident is recorded for violence; foul language; absconding etc. So far this year 7 minor (3 classroom, 1 Junior play equipment, 2 COLA, 1 oval) and 9 (7 classroom, 1 basketball, 1 oval) major incidents have been recorded by teaching and support staff.

# YEAR 3/4 NEWS

It has been a great start to 2022 in the Year 3/4 cohort! In English we have been learning about narrative structure and effective ways to tell stories. In Maths we have been exploring the properties of odd and even numbers and identifying and continuing number patterns. We have also been exploring graphing, including collecting data and representing that data. In the Visual Arts, we have created self-portraits inspired by New Zealand artist Frances Hodgkins, with artworks reflecting who students are. We look forward to continuing our learning this term!











#### **COVID-19 SYMPTOMS**

People with a confirmed case of COVID-19 have reported a wide range of symptoms, which can range from mild to severe. See below table for symptoms of COVID-19:

#### Main Symptoms of COVID-19:

• Fever or chills, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, loss of smell or taste, runny or blocked nose

#### Less common Symptoms:

• Muscle pain, joint pain, diarrhoea, nausea, headache, vomiting, loss of appetite, fatigue, unexplained chest pain, conjunctivitis (eye infection)

Please keep your child at home and get them tested if they have any of the above symptoms. For further information about symptoms and getting tested, visit the <u>https://www.covid19.act.gov.au/stay-safe-andhealthy/symptoms-and-getting-tested/where-to-get-tested-in-the-act</u>.

If your child tests positive with a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) they must:

- Isolate for 7 days and follow the guidance on the COVID-19
- Register the positive RAT result with ACT Health using the online form and
- Contact the school on 6142 3250 or via email at info@yarralumplaps.act.edu.au

If your child tests negative with a RAT but has ongoing COVID-19 symptoms, they should have a PCR test.

If the PCR test is positive please follow the guidance for people with COVID-19.

If the PCR test is negative children can return to school when they are well again.

#### Mask rules remain in schools



The mask rules for ACT schools and early childhood settings have not changed. Face masks must continue to be worn by staff and visitors in all indoor spaces at school and early childhood education and care settings.

Students in years 7 to 12 are also required to wear a face mask while in an indoor space at school.

The wearing of masks for primary school students is at the discretion of the student and their parents/carers but is not recommended for children in ECECs, or preschool to year 2. The measures we have in place, including mask-wearing, are helping to limit the impact of COVID-19 and ensure continuity of learning for our students.

#### **PHONES**

Nowadays many students carry personal phones so they can communicate with parents on the way to and from school. For many reasons including cyber safety and the risk of loss, theft or breakage, students' use of mobile phones is not permitted on school grounds. Phones should be handed to the front office to be locked away during the school day and then collected at 3.15pm. If parents or students need to contact each other during the school day this can be done through the front office.

Under no circumstances should any student use their phone to take photographs of other students or staff.

#### **SUNSMART HATS**

Students are expected to wear a broad brimmed or hybrid buck style hats when outdoors at school. Our Sun Smart rule is "No hat, play in the shade".

#### **SUPERVISION BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL**

Students should arrive at school no earlier than 8.30am unless attending Before School Care. They should also be collected by 3.15pm unless they are walking home or attending After School Care. Students who have not been collected by 3.20pm will be taken to wait in the front office and their parents will be contacted. If you have an emergency in the afternoon that stops you getting to school on time, please don't worry. Just let the front office know so we can reassure your child.
