Dear families,

Welcome

It is exciting to have all our students and staff return after the school holidays with the addition of a few new students who have joined our school. We extend a warm welcome to all our new students and families who have joined our community. Term 4 is again jam packed full of learning and excitement for the students. Please continue to refer to the school calendar for all events. We have also added the calendar to our school website if you need to check. We will continue to add items to the electronic sign at the front of the school and provide weekly updates on our Facebook page. Our graduating year 6 students have a big term ahead of them with transitions to high school, Year 5/6 camp and their graduation ceremony.

Building Works

During the school holidays a number of windows were repainted, including the hall and the netball court. Our Perla classroom was due to have new cabinetry installed, but unfortunately during the removal process mould was discovered on the wall hidden by the old built in cabinet. Our Perla students have relocated to the classroom near the hall while the remediation and works are completed. Our community garden and fence line running along the drain from Loftus street has had significant works completed. Plumbing work is also occurring at the school with a fenced off section at the rear carpark of the school.

Italian Program

This week we were lucky to have an Italian book fair at our school hosted by Intext books. Italian teachers at YPS and across the system were able to purchase resources to support their teaching and student learning. A number of our families have also purchased resources to support their child's learning at home. During this week's assembly our students presented nursery rhymes, poetry and speeches in Italian. The President of Dante Alighieri and the Director of the Educational and Cultural Office for the Italian Embassy assisted in judging the Italian speeches and presented Italian books to the winning classes and individuals. Dante Alighieri provided the school with another Italian Language Assistant three days a week for term 4 supporting our students learning in Italian.

Montessori 40th Anniversary

This Sunday our Montessori will be celebrating its 40th anniversary on the school grounds. Proceedings will start at 11am including a smoking ceremony, indigenous storytelling, a 19 piece swing band, local authors, circus performance and Italian community choir. Food and drinks will also be sold on the day. We look forward to seeing past and present community members in attendance.

- Monday 28 November (week 8)




STAR AWARD

Tija M October 2022






YEAR 3/4 NEWS

As we begin our final term this year, we continue to make wonderful progress and achieve the goals we set ourselves. In English we have also been using a range of strategies to improve our comprehension of texts we read. The children apply reading strategies to a range of texts, choosing a strategy that helps them in a specific circumstance. Sometimes, the strategy is to help read an unfamiliar word – for instance, "chunking", where they look for smaller words inside the bigger word which helps to make sense of it. At other times, the strategies support understanding and comprehension. These can include making connections between a text and their own life experience or other texts they have read or predicting what might come next based on what they have already read. We look forward to refining our use of reading strategies as the year goes on.

In Maths we have been consolidating our times tables through activities including tables snap, number tennis and online times tables games. The students are making consistent growth with both their speed and accuracy in the times tables and are continuing to apply this knowledge to game situations. This supports our work with mental and written computations involving division and multiplication.

This term year 3/4 has started to work on the topic angles in Italian. We firstly represented angles in real life that surround us every day and we then applied our understanding to name the different angles and calculate their degrees using a Goniometro.



As part of our HASS unit we are exploring different perspectives and how the same events can be interpreted differently depending on the experiences of those involved. This has included First Nations connections to Country and contact between the First Fleet and Australia's First Nations local inhabitants. Connections between people and environments have long been an important part of our history and we look forward to continuing our studies in this area. The children engaged thoughtfully with the concepts and showed impressive maturity in exploring different perspectives to these issues.

We look forward to the learning coming up throughout the rest of the year!

PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

I have taken my words this week directly from the School Captain's presentation at COLA. The Captains lead this large gathering each week and give a PBL message to the whole school.

"This week's STAR value is RESPECT. Respect is a two way street - if you want to receive it, you also need to give it. Speaking to others as you would like to be spoken to, accepting different ideas and opinions, using spaces and equipment as they are designed to be used, and listening when someone else is speaking are all examples of things you can do to show RESPECT at school.

Respect is so important, famous American singer Aretha Franklin sang a song about it! Here's an anonymous quote to keep in mind when thinking about respect:

"Show respect to people even when they don't deserve it. Respect is a reflection of your character rather than theirs."

So far this month we have the following positive interactions reported by the teaching team.

Safe = 30, Team Player = 131, Active Learner = 208, Respectful = 195.

There have been 5 minor incidents - biggest problem seems to be harrassment. 2 major negatives which have both involved serious threatening behaviour.

If you would like to be involved in the school PBL team and have a say in the way we manage behaviours; the messaging that goes home; the signage around the school; or anything else related to Positive Behaviours for Learning, please don't hesitate to contact me to talk about how you can get involved.

This year at Yarralumla we will be trialling a modified transition process to help students move smoothly from their 2022 cohort, classroom and teachers into 2023. We've listened to feedback, made a plan and modified it after sharing ideas with students, teachers and parents. Some parts you will recognise, but some will be new. In each newsletter between now and the end of the year, you'll find a transitions update.

In a nutshell, the plan looks like this:

- All students nominate five preferred classmates for 2023 in class
- Parents offered opportunity to submit requests for 2023 classes
- •Teachers and school leaders create class groups for 2023
- •Teachers get to know students in their 2023 cohort by talking to students and families, reading plans and reports, and talking to their current teachers
- •Students engage in orientation visits with 2023 cohort
- •Transfer round completed and teachers paired with 2023 class groups
- Families informed of 2023 teachers
- •ILP reviews will involve handovers to 2023 teachers (where possible)
- •Semester 2 reports go home
- Parent-teacher interviews take place in weeks 9 and 10
- •New families and students with support needs are invited to a structured orientation session on the first day of term 1 in 2023

Term 1, 2023 weeks 1-2

Term 4, 2022

- Teachers facilitate 1 hour induction session in classroom on first day of term for new students
- •Classes (teachers and students) establish behaviour expectations and set learning goals for first semester.
- Bilingual students engage in brief orientation with 2nd teacher the day before classes change.
- Teachers draft plans for students with support needs and share with parents before ILP meetings in week 3.


- •The transition team seeks feedback on transition process from families, students and teachers
- •Feedback is applied to improve 2023-24 transition plan


