Dear Parents and Carers,

I have walked through senior classrooms this week and have been amazed at the quality of the Rostrum Speeches that children have been presenting. Classmates have been busy peer assessing their peers' speeches and teachers have been providing feedback on their efforts. Well done to all of our speakers!

Our ACT Education Directorate supports schools with several professionals that work with our teachers and with our Executive to ensure we provide the best possible learning experiences for our students at Yarralumla Primary. This week we have had visits from our Allied Heath Speech Pathologist and Occupational Therapist. Their core role is to work with teachers to support identified students best access the curriculum. We have also worked with our Targeted Support Team to develop processes and different ways of identifying student's sensory needs.

We are so happy to have our Literacy Intervention Programs up and running this week. Yarralumla Primary run daily small group sessions to support our students' literacy acquisition. Mini-Lit (yrs 1-2) and Macq-Lit (yrs 3-6) are research-based literacy interventions that form part of our Tier 3 Intervention processes. Your child's teacher will have contacted you to inform you that your child is participating in this program.

Please keep an eye out for information on our upcoming parent sessions run by ACT Education Directorate School Psychologists. The first one on supporting children with Anxiety will be held on Tuesday 6th June from 8.30-9.30am in our Library. The second one will be on Protective Behaviours Training for Parents on 21st June from 3.15-4.45pm, also in our library. Please RSVP for those sessions via info@yarralumlaps.act.edu.au

P&C GENERAL MEETING - MONDAY 15 MAY

This was the first P&C meeting for Term 2 and the first P&C meeting for the new P&C Executive Committee.

The meeting agenda was significantly enlivened with some interesting topics in Other Business / Altre Questioni which were submitted by email last week. It was wonderful to receive these submissions. Keep them coming!

The following topics were discussed with broad interest at the P&C meeting. There will be further detail in the meeting minutes which will be promulgated in due course.

PATHWAYS TO HIGH SCHOOL - CONTINUATION OF ITALIAN EDUCATION FOR EX-YPS STUDENTS FROM THE BILINGUAL STREAM

YPS has many students who live outside the Priority Enrolment Area (PEA) for the school. The attraction of the bilingual education opportunities and Italian program draws students from across the region to YPS.

Unfortunately, there are limited high schools which offer Italian as a subject. There are even fewer high schools which offer advanced Italian as would be appropriate for an ex-YPS student from the bilingual program.

Alfred Deakin High School (ADHS) currently offers advanced Italian as a subject. Due to student capacity limitations and high demand for places at ADHS, many former YPS students who live outside of the PEA are not able to enrol. In most cases, this is the sad end of their ability to continue learning and loving Italian in a formal education setting.

However, the ACT Government has recently announced a consultation phase for its Education Legislation Reform project. To read about the consultation process, please see:

The P&C will be making a submission on this issue, suggesting that former YPS students (regardless of home location) should be assured of enrolment at ADHS if they wish to continue their Italian education.

This has been a problem for out-of-area YPS families for many years. The Education Legislation Reform project will hopefully be our chance to rectify this problem for students graduating from YPS.

Reporting student achievement in the ACT 2023

ACT public schools are expected to provide a formal written report to parents and carers of students from Preschool to Year 12, twice a year. These formal reports form part of the suite of relevant and purposeful opportunities schools use to communicate student learning to families throughout the year.

In addition, our school shares student learning and progress throughout the year through informal processes including, learning journeys, parent teacher interviews, assembly performances and Seesaw.

Upcoming written reports for the end of Semester 1 and Semester 2 will revert to business as usual for 2023. The inclusion of written comments in semester reports remains a school-based decision and is not compulsory. YPS parents will receive a written general comment which addresses English, Italian and Numeracy.

IMPORTANT ENROLMENT INFORMATION

PRESCHOOL

All four-year-old ACT children are guaranteed a place in a public preschool. However, you are not guaranteed a place at the preschool site of your preference, due to capacity constraints at some sites. You are encouraged to apply for the preschool for your local primary school (or NSW Pathway school for NSW residents), which offers you the greatest continuity for the transition to kindergarten. All preschools offer a high-quality early childhood education.

Preschool places are not allocated on a first come first served basis. Applications are prioritised in this order:

- 1. Individual circumstances based on student wellbeing.
- 2. ACT-resident siblings of students concurrently enrolled in the primary school (ie: applicants who will be attending the school in the same year as a currently enrolled student).
- 3. Children living within the Priority Enrolment Area (PEA) of the primary school, up to the limits of available places.

Where there are not enough places for all children living in the PEA of the primary school, applications will be ranked by 'proximity', that is the distance that your child lives from the preschool. The distance is measured 'as the crow flies'. The Directorate will find a place for all other children at a preschool, considering where your child lives and the capacity available.

Please note: A number of preschools are experiencing high demand for places from their local families**. At these high-demand preschools, applicants who apply before midnight on 2 June 2023, and who do not meet the prioritisation criteria, will be allocated to:

- the preschool of the primary school in their Priority Enrolment Area where capacity exists, or
- the closest preschool to their home with capacity.

KINDERGARTEN TO YEAR 6

- Online enrolment in the ACT can be made for children at any time.
- Pre-schoolers will be automatically enrolled into kindergarten for the following year if they are already attending preschool at their local Priority Enrolment Area primary school.
- Students attending preschool outside their Priority Enrolment Area will need to submit a new enrolment application for kindergarten in the following year, which will be assessed based on the relevant criteria.
- If you have a sibling concurrently attending Red Hill School and live outside our priority enrolment area (but in the ACT) we may be able to offer your next child a place, subject to capacity in the relevant year level. This includes step/half and cultural siblings

Kindergarten Term 2 Week 4

Literacy - We have been exploring adding detail and describing words to our writing to make it more interesting for our readers. It also helps to build a picture in our minds.

We are continuing with Daily 5 and getting better with the routine.

Don't forget to keep sending in home reading folders to change daily, especially on Fridays as that is when we check to see how many nights reading has been done, and give out stickers!

Maths - Location, location, location! We have been working on our positional language such as above, under, between and next to. We are also exploring simple maps and what their purpose is. We are reading Rosie's Walk and mapping out her journey!

We are continuing to work on teen numbers, ordering them, counting them, and making groups of objects to match those numbers. We have used ten frames and number lines to do this.


Year One Learning Snapshots


Groundwater matters!














Year 3 – 4 Update

5/6 Zafferano have worked very hard on their HASS assignments producing some amazing presentations.




5/6 Gialla had a busy fortnight listening to Rostrum Speeches and finishing off their HASS assignments on Colonisation and Federation.
