YPS P&C ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - 18 MARCH 2024

The P&C's AGM was held on Monday 18 March 2024. Thank you to all of those who attended, both in person and online. The good news is that all Executive Committee positions have been filled by enthusiastic volunteers, some continuing from 2023 and some new parents. It is looking like it will be a great team this year!

Of course, the P&C is always keen to have further general members on the Executive Committee. New members can be appointed by casual vacancy throughout the year. SEESAW - WINDOW INTO THE CLASSROOM!

YPS pays a large amount of money so that families can use the Seesaw app as a wonderful window into their child's classroom. Signor Evans often reports at P&C meetings how many parents are visiting SeeSaw. This is always a lower number of parents than I am expecting.

Different classes use Seesaw in different ways. Some classes allow students to post their own content on Seesaw about something that they have found fun. Other classes post interesting group and/or individual updates from the teachers. If you are not receiving Seesaw updates, you might wish to speak to your child's teacher to



ensure that you have the right logins to receive posts. It is always a lovely surprise to see a Seesaw notification pop up during the working day!

SORA - E-BOOKS AND AUDIOBOOKS

There is another app I wanted to mention - **Sora**. The ACT Education Directorate provides free access to Sora. This app contains over 7,000 e-books and audiobooks suitable for primary school aged students. The e-books come in both read-to-yourself format and read-along format. All the authors beloved by my kids had their books on Sora. The audio books are wonderful for long drives or maybe in bed at night. The e-books are wonderful for travelling so you don't have to lug around heavy books. The only downside is that I have not found any books in Italian on Sora.

All students at ACT public schools appear to have Sora access. To start, download the Sora app or go to https://soraapp.com/. Select ACT Education Directorate when asked to find your school (not YPS). The Username will be your child's seven digit student number. The passwords are set by YPS so please inquire with your child's teacher to use this amazing resource that is available to all of us.



YPS P&C GENERAL MEETING - 18 MARCH 2024

The P&C held a regular P&C meeting after the AGM on Monday night. To be honest, this part of the night was much more interesting than the election of P&C office bearers at the AGM!

Unfortunately Signor Evans was away so we missed his usual fascinating report. However, the following topics were discussed with passion and interest all round.

YPS House names. This was a topic of great interest, noting the continuing temporary colour house names. Where is this at? Who is deciding? When do suggestions close? How will voting occur? When will voting occur? What are the options? Who is culling the names to a shortlist? We hope for resolution of this issue very soon.

P&C fundraising transfers to YPS. This topic generated a lot of debate, particularly why the P&C had not transferred more money to YPS in 2022 and 2023. Members questioned the P&C Executive about how funding decisions are made in relation to P&C money.

YPS funding. This flowed into a discussion of how YPS is funded more generally by other sources of money. Voluntary contributions, funding from the ACT Education Directorate, grants? Who makes decisions about what funding is spent on, both infrastructure and resources? How are these decisions made? How is the Italian bilingual program funded? Does it get special funding due to the unique nature of the program?

Fundraising from 2023 Colour Run. This further flowed into a discussion about the mechanics of the expenditure of the money from the 2023 Colour Run.

Parent WhatsApp groups. This topic generated much debate. As background, earlier in the year the P&C publicised parent-run WhatsApp groups for each year group with the view to facilitating wide participation and communication amongst the YPS community.

The WhatsApp groups are a wonderful way of reminding parents of events, sign ups, volunteering opportunities, school note return requirements, birthday party invitations and more. They can also involve parents expressing frustrations and/or concerns about matters concerning YPS.

Debate on the subject of the WhatsApp groups covered a wide variety of views. Are the WhatsApp groups simply the 2023 equivalent of 'school gate discussions' amongst parents in the past? What should happen if the WhatsApp discussions were to damage an individual's reputation? What other ways are there of dealing with issues that are discussed on WhatsApp? What could happen if WhatsApp group discussions were considered to be defamatory? Is setting communication rules for a WhatsApp group limiting parents' free speech and their ability to collectivise? What would an appropriate code of conduct for a WhatsApp group be?

No resolutions resulted from these debates. However, there was broad agreement that discussions on WhatApp should be respectful of all.

Counsellor Corner

Welcome to another school year at Yarralumla Primary School! We hope the transition back to school has been a smooth and happy one. If you have a child who has started Kindergarten (or later years!) and is experiencing separation anxiety, these are some great tips from Australian parenting guru, Maggie Dent:

- Tell your child to imagine you are sending them rainbows of love from your heart to theirs and ask them to send one to you when they miss you.
- Draw funny pictures on their lunch bags or leave a lovely note in their lunch box.
- Teach them how to take 3 big breaths and breathe out the butterflies hiding in their tummy or gently rub their tummy telling the butterflies they are safe.
- Have them wear a lanyard with a photo of someone they love they can look at it often and even 'talk' to them throughout the day.
- · Help build a special connection to one teacher or staff member who is nurturing their transition to school. Have a photo of them up at home and talk about them sometimes.

Something we focus on at school is the development of prosocial skills such as sharing, taking turns and being respectful. These are skills that sometimes take a while to learn, just like reading, maths, and riding a bike. Prosocial behaviour is important for developing healthy relationship skills and has even been shown to enhance mental functioning and improve academic performance in children.

Here are ideas that you as parents and carers can do to support the development of prosocial behaviour in your children:

- Be ready to listen if your child wants to talk about school. This can be a great chance for you to express your family values about things like kindness, respect for self and others etc
- Praise your child for sharing, taking turns and playing fair. Point out what your child did well. For example, 'I thought it was respectful and fair the way you shook hands with the other team at the end of the game'.
- Talk about things people do that make a difference to others and why this is good.
- Talk about how your child's behaviour might affect others. For example, 'Imagine if we only brought enough birthday cake for your friends. How would the other people in your class feel?'
- Give your child opportunities to do helpful or kind things.
- Talk about the thoughts and feelings of characters in stories or TV shows.

Here are some simple prompts that may improve these conversations for you and your child...
