Reports

During week 1 you received a test email for Academic Reports and a hard copy information sheet. If you have not received this email or wish to update your contact details, please see Teresa. Another test email will be sent in week 4 in preparation for receiving your child's report later in the term.

Reporting Student Achievement in ACT Public Schools

In 2019 the ACT Education Directorate are introducing a common report format for students in Kindergarten to Year 10 through the new School Administration System (SAS). This change is occurring across all ACT Public Schools via a staged roll out. This means that all ACT public schools will be using the common report format by the end of Semester 1 2020. The new system report format uses the Achievement Standards directly from the Australian Curriculum. Achievement Standards set the goal for what all students should learn in each year as they progress through their school life.

From the first year of schooling to Year 10, students develop knowledge and skills in eight learning areas: ➤ English ➤ The Arts ➤ Mathematics ➤ Technologies ➤ Science ➤ Languages ➤ Health and Physical Education (HPE) ➤ Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS) Students will be allocated an achievement level against each standard using a five-point scale: limited, partial, at standard, high or outstanding. Students in Years 1-10 will also receive an overall grade for the learning area using a five-point A-E scale.

Below are some examples of Achievement Standard statements that may appear on a student report.

Some example English statements that may appear on a report:

Foundation/Kindergarten	Year 4	Year 9
Reads high-frequency words and blends sounds orally to read consonant-vowel-consonant words	Fluently reads texts that include varied sentence structures, unfamiliar vocabulary including multisyllabic words	Selects evidence from texts to analyse and explain how language choices and conventions are used to influence an audience

Some example **Mathematics** statements that may appear on a report:

Foundation/Kindergarten	Year 4	Year 9
Counts to and from 20 and orders small collections	Chooses appropriate strategies for calculations involving multiplication and division	Recognises the connections between similarity and the trigonometric ratios

In the ACT, student work at standard is considered a 'C' grade which indicates the student is on track and demonstrating achievement at the standard for their age and ability. **A 'C' grade is to be celebrated.**


As with other ACT public schools, we are aiming to email our Semester 2 reports to families and as such we will be running a test email function to determine that we have correct email addresses.





Safe Parking Behaviours

With the Fete coming up here is a timely reminder from the ACT Government.

Unsafe driving and parking behaviours increase the potential road safety risk for children around schools. Road safety is a shared responsibility, it is important the road rules are followed near our school to ensure the entire school community feels safe.

Please remember children are more at risk than adults around schools because they are smaller and less visible to drivers. They are also less predictable and less experienced, which makes them more likely to make errors of judgement.

Failing to follow simple road rules like parking on the verge, in no stopping zones, in bus stops, near children's crossings, on footpaths or across driveways increases the risk to children around schools. Please do the right thing to create a safe environment around our school

Children's Asthma Education Service

Canberra Health Services Children's Asthma Education Service that is available to your students who have asthma is free.

Asthma affects 1 in 10 children. Students with asthma have been found to be generally less active than their non-asthmatic peers and have an increase in school absenteeism. Asthma education for children and adolescents improves lung function and feelings of self-control, reduce absenteeism from school, number of days with restricted activity, number of visits to an emergency department, and possibly number of disturbed nights.

The Children's Asthma Education Service is available to all children in the ACT and surrounds up to the age of 18. Providing children, young people and their families with initial and continuing support to manage their asthma by Registered Nurse asthma educators.

This includes helping:

- Children, young people and families understand asthma, asthma first aid, how asthma medications work, and when to use them
- Families manage wheezing in the first years of life
- Primary school aged children with symptom recognition and increasing independence
- Teenagers self-manage support and device options.

If you feel any students/families would benefit from receiving asthma education, please advise them to call the **Community Health Intake line on 5124 9977** to make an appointment. Also attached is our service poster, for inclusion in your school newsletter.
