Dear Parents and Carers,

Teresa's Retirement

Teresa Smith has been in our front office at YPS since 2009, but after 14 years of love and commitment to the students, staff and parents of YPS she has decided to retire. During her 14 years of service at YPS she has seen the growth of students from Preschool to Year 6 from their enrolment in the school through till their graduation. She has assisted many of the students with bumps and bruises, lost jumpers, forgotten lunch boxes, music lessons, permission notes and late pickups in the afternoons. We wish Teresa well in her next chapter of her life and thank her greatly for all that she has done for the YPS community. Teresa's last day is this Friday.

Italian Programme

This week we also farewell maestra Francesca who has been with us for the past five years working with our classroom teachers to increase the Italian levels of our students. It has been a big move for Francesca over the past five years leaving her school community, family and husband in Italy to pursue the opportunity in Canberra. Francesca has been instrumental in sharing her knowledge with our Italian classroom teachers. She has run acceleration programs for native speaking and advanced students. Francesca has also assisted students who have struggled with the Italian language. Her skills and knowledge will be greatly missed and we wish her well in her future educational pursuits.

Last fortnight we notified our families who were interest in the community trip to Italy that we were unable to proceed with the trip in 2023.

Thank you for expressing an interest in the community Italy trip planned for October 2023. Unfortunately, due to time constraints for staff approvals our trip is unable to proceed this year. As you will be aware, the COVID-19 pandemic meant our schools were unable to travel overseas for a number of years. Since this time there have been some changes to the overseas travel policy and procedures which requires us to review elements of our trip. Unfortunately the work required cannot be completed in the timeframe needed for this trip to go ahead. Whilst we appreciate that this news is disappointing, we are working closely with the Education Directorate to ensure we are ready for a trip in future years. We will keep you updated as we progress.

Maestra Lynden and myself will be attending an overseas excursions meeting being held by the Education Directorate today to plan for our future community trip. Through this meeting we hope to determine a new date for the trip to occur and confirm this with our Italian schools. We expect that with a new policy that their may be

changes that the school will need to make from previous trips for the trip to occur including billeting. As soon as we have further information we will share this with the community. Our Community Trip plays an important role in the development of our students language acquisition skills but also has important benefits for our teachers, resources use within the school and strong connection with the University to collaboratively work with and develop future Italian teachers at our school.

We try to provide our students with alternative play programmes during our lunch breaks. 


STAR AWARD



Year One Learning Snapshots


Term 2, weeks 9 - 10


In classes Corallo and Magenta, we have continued to work on writing narratives. Our favourite experience so far has been turning off the lights, lowering the blinds, getting our thinking caps on, and writing a whole class narrative. Students shared ideas for the characters, setting, problem, and resolution and we voted for our favourite ones. We then printed off our class narrative and each student was responsible for illustrating a page. Students put in their best and most creative effort, resulting in two very imaginative and exciting class narratives.

In Maths, we have been working on identifying the patterns within odd and even number sequences, skip counting by 2s through odd and even numbers, skip counting by 5s, and skip counting by 10s.

In HASS (Geography) we have been learning about the traditional owners of our local area and the special connections Ngunnawal / Ngambri people have to our surrounding Country / Place. We learned about the meaning of the name 'Yarralumla', explored Google Earth to locate our school and local surrounds, and analysed and recorded (through drawings) the oldest identified drawings in the ACT - Ngunnawal rock art at the Yankee Hat Rock art site in Namadgi National Park.

Students have also been busy making Henri Matisse style collages. This involved students painting their own interesting shapes cut out of paper and gluing them into interesting, vibrant arrangements.

Dear Families.

The ICAS Parent portal closes on Friday 7th July (in the holidays). If you would like your child to participate in ICAS this year, please follow the steps below as soon as possible.

What is ICAS?

ICAS is an online academic competition for students in year 2 and above. Each ICAS assessment is taken as a formal, sit-down test, and the results are compared to other students across the country who have signed up. The questions are designed to assess problem-solving and higher-order thinking skills in each subject. If your child enjoys and/or excels in a particular subject **and** has no anxiety around test conditions, then this is a great opportunity. All tests will take place in term 3, and we have set up a parent payment portal so you can order and pay directly with ICAS.

This year at Yarralumla we are offering Digital Technologies and Writing (both in week 4), English (week 5), Science (week 6), and Mathematics (week 7).

Every student who participates will receive a printed certificate in assembly, and an online results report. Top performers will be eligible for medals. Learn more about ICAS <u>here</u>. (https://www.icasassessments.com/products-icas)

How to participate in ICAS

If you wish for your child to participate in ICAS this year, please:

- 3. enter our school's access code OHI115
- 4. enter your child's details, select the tests you would like to purchase, then proceed to payment.

After payment is made via the Parent Payment System, you will receive an order confirmation email, please keep this for your records.

ICAS Results and Certificates

We will notify you of the exact dates that we run ICAS at the school and when your child's ICAS results are ready. Certificates will be presented in assembly once the school receives them. The back of the certificates show ICAS results and the login details, "TAP ID and Pin", that you and your child need to enter the <u>Results Portal</u> orti.icasassessments.com/ortiStudent




