I am pretty sure that we say this almost every week but WOW the year sure seems to have gone by quickly. We are definitely into the home stretch now with a lot of fabulous things happening over the next three weeks.

Firstly, a word of praise regarding the carpark situation. All of the teachers and the leadership team want to thank you for the way you have transitioned to a drop off and pick up routine. It is working seamlessly and we appreciate the patience you are showing, especially on these many, many, many rainy days. Whilst it may be taking slightly longer, we are a strong community team ensuring that our students remain as safe as possible.

As you will have read in last fortnight's newsletter, we are in the process of creating classes for 2022. As part of this process the teachers have helped students to create a list of people that they want to be in a class with. The suggestions being that they need to be a good learning friend and someone who they can be the best version of themselves with. Reports will be sent home on Friday 3rd December via email. You will be receiving a timetable for interviews if you wish to book a short conversation with your child's teacher. If you feel that you have had enough communication with your child/ren's teachers over the course of the year, then there is no need to book a time.

Our yearlong writing focus is wrapping up over the next few weeks and teachers are all working on a final push to develop strong, interested writers to hand on to new teachers in 2022. Some of the pieces being created are wonderful and I am sure you will enjoy reading the work when books come home in week 11.

Our Positive Behaviour for Learning team continue to support the staff with noticing wonderful behaviours and acknowledging them. In the last week we have had a total of 535 positive incidents recorded by teaching staff. Safe = 107; Team players = 94; Active learner = 160; and Respectful = 174. In the same period, we had 3 minor negative incidents. Two involving mild disruption in class and one for inappropriate language. With reminders about following the school STAR values, students correct their behaviour choices. In this tricky term, we have been impressed with the work of all of our students. They have been resilient learners and have been incredibly adaptable.

A final quick plea to ensure your children understand putting their jackets, jumpers and hats INTO their bags when they take them off rather than ON or NEXT TO. Teachers give these reminders multiple times every day and yet the lost property containers continue to fill.

I hope you all have exciting indoor plans for the weekend and I wish you all restful, laughter filled days.

Please keep your child home if they are sick



The COVID-19 pandemic is not over. Restrictions are still in place - including in our schools - and we all need to be vigilant. This includes not sending children to school sick.

If your child has any kind of illness, even if it is just a runny nose, they must not come to school. If your child is unwell at school, you will be asked to collect them. Please phone the front office when you arrive, and we will walk your child to your car.

It is important that we limit the spread of disease during this pandemic. By doing the right thing you can help keep Canberra COVID safe. ACT Education COVID-19 Pathway out of Lock Down: Supporting Students to follow Health Guidelines.

Staying home when sick - Children who are unwell must not attend school and should stay home and get tested. If they attend while unwell, they must be sent home. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from the GP is sufficient to allow return to school without a negative test.

When collecting items such as uniform or resources, please park at the curb and call the front office and we will bring items out to you.

COVID-safe Plans

COVID-safe plans and measures to limit the spread of COVID-19 continue to be effective in keeping our school community safe. Student cohorting, vaccinated staff, use of masks, physical distancing, additional cleaning, improved ventilation, use of the Check in CBR app and limitations on outside visitors entering schools have been part of these plans.

It is important for us to remain vigilant about sending home anyone in the school setting who is displaying COVID-19 symptoms, no matter how minor, and we thank you for your support in not sending symptomatic children to school

EARLY PICK-UP

If your child needs to be picked up early from school it is important that you plan ahead and ensure you have ample time before your appointment.

Due to the current restrictions with parents entering the school building, we are relying on teachers to send students to the office to wait to be collected. Front office staff are also collecting children from classrooms.

It is a timely reminder to remember that teaching staff are busy teaching and managing the children in their class, this means that sometimes they may forget to send your child down. Front office staff are happy to help, however we may not always have staff readily available to collect your child from class and are usually unable to leave the office unattended. We appreciate your patience and understanding. Please remember that everyone deserves to be treated fairly and with respect.

- In the first case please email your child's teacher and advise them of when you need to collect your child. Please give as much notice as possible as teachers are busy and can only check their emails a few times a day.
- Your child's teacher will send them to the office to wait to be collected.
- When you arrive please wait outside and call the front office we will bring your child out to you.
- It is important to note that if you present to the school before 3:00pm with no prior contact you may need to wait.

- Top-up your account using VISA, Mastercard, PayPal or by direct deposit
- Click on "Start an order for...." and select "uniform"

To make sure your uniform arrives before school starts next year you must place your order by **10 December 2021**. If you place your order after this date we cannot guarantee that it will be available for the first week of school.
