Dear Parents and Carers,

#### **Italian Program**

YPS is currently in correspondence with Brunswick South Primary School in Melbourne to enhance our students written Italian proficiency by establishing writing opportunities through pen pals. Brunswick South Primary is an Italian bilingual school. We look forward to developing this relationship in the coming weeks and sharing our students writing via Facebook, Seesaw and the Newsletter. Our three students from the University of Bergamo have booked their flights to Australia and will be joining our classes mid-year. We will be asking our local families to host the three students during their stay in Australia. Francesca our Italian Teaching Assistant is currently in Italy and will re-join our Italian program in week 3 of Term 2.

#### **Building Works**

Our two new classrooms next to the hall are due for completion in the upcoming school holidays. The windows are due for removal this weekend including the canteen. The new classrooms will be used as building works continue around our school including the replacement of classroom windows. Year level classes will move into the new classrooms while their windows are being replaced. The Education Directorate has been supporting the school in employing removalists to move all furniture, teaching resources and student items. The school will notify the community when classes will be moving during term 2. The marque will remain at the front of the school for the vacation care program run by Aeonacademy. Once the classrooms are completed the marque will be removed.

#### **Cross Country**

YPS will be holding their school Cross Country carnival on Wednesday 4 May on the school grounds. Please continue to provide your child/ren with an opportunity to run during the upcoming school holidays in preparation for the carnival. Students will be practicing their running during Physical Education lessons.

#### Assembly

Congratulations to all our Merit Certificate recipients and STAR Award winners from our week 8 assembly hosted by Year 5/6. Our STAR awards continue to be sponsored by Adrian from Southern Property in 2022. Our final assembly of the term will be held next week in the hall. The assembly will be hosted by Year 1. Unfortunately parents are still unable to attend due to COVID restrictions.

#### **Parents Satisfaction Survey**

This fortnight we review the Parent Satisfaction Survey Results from 2021. Thank you to the 78 parents that completed the survey last year. 84.21% of surveys were completed by the mother, 7.89% by the father and 7.89% by both parents. This data is used to inform our 2022 Action Plan and set strategic directives for 2022. The school

will survey the parent community at the start of term 2 to take a deep dive into some of the questions where the school has only had small improvements and are still below the ACT average. The school will be seeking future strategies to assist in improving these areas over the next six months.

#### **AFL Clinics**


Students in Year K-6 have been participating in AFL clinics as part of their Physical Education lessons in the last week. The clinics have been run by Eastlake Football Club.



# **PBL** (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

We continue to teach our students what TO do on the playground and in the classrooms rather than what NOT to do. Following some issues on the playground this week I want to let you know how the staff at Yarralumla deal with tricky situations.

If there is a minor or a major incident the following occurs

- Teachers unpack what happened with students concerned. If necessary, they have a teaching partner take their class for ten minutes so they can work through this. A restorative conference approach is taken here. <u>https://inclusive-solutions.com/restorative-conferencing/-</u> If this has been the case, the incident is written up on our system and everyone is ready to move on.
- 2) If it is an incident involving physical aggression for example, the incident is referred to a Deputy.
- 3) The aggressor spends some time (varying according to severity and repetitiveness) outside the Deputy office where they reflect and spend time talking through their response and various choices they could have made.
- 4) When the "victim/s" are ready, a restorative conference is conducted by the Deputy.

S = Safe. We teach our students how to be safe in the playground. For example: Reminders are given when soccer is being played to keep hands and feet to ourselves. There have been occasions when we give students a rest from playing soccer until all players can agree to the rules being played by

T = Team player. We teach our students to work as a team when working out the rules to a game. Will the soccer goalie be permitted to be a run back goalie? How will disputes be resolved if there is a disagreement on whether a penalty should be allowed? If there are ongoing issues with a particular type of game, teachers provide reminders before sending students out to play.

A = Active Learner. We ask students to reflect on what they have learnt. To continue with the soccer example, we ask – how did the solution work today? What else could you try? Can you think of a solution?

R = Respectful. We teach our students to play respectfully on the playground by setting games up in PE and Sport lessons to model appropriate behaviours. Teachers demonstrate how to respond to challenging situations like when someone is out in cricket and yet did not see it that way. Wem suggest ways that students could protest a decision whilst taking the emotion out of the moment

Data from PBL

eSTARS: so far in March we have had 1468 eSTARS awarded. There have been 4 students reach the milestone of 50 with ONE student the 100 milestone so far this month.

SAFE = 205 TEAM PLAYER = 286 ACTIVE LEARNER = 551 RESPECTFUL = 426

Minor Negative Incidents = 46 Many of these involved students using unkind words to other students in playground areas of the school and are evenly spread from our youngest students to our senior students. Teachers deal with these incidents on the spot and conduct restorative conferences. The other big contributor to this number is non-compliance in which a student is refusing to follow instructions given by a teacher. Most of these situations have occurred during play times where a student is behaving in an unsafe way.

Major Negative Incidents = 5 (1 in the classroom and 4 in playground areas). Four of these incidents involved physical aggression and one was for threatening behaviour.

# YEAR 1

Year One have been working hard on producing good quality writing and linking it with pictures they have made.



In Science we have been exploring a variety of habitats to find out how these habitats meet animals' needs. As biologists do, we have observed small habitats, such as gardens, and we have identified sources of food and shelters for the insects that live.







To learn about Italian phonics patterns, we have been listening carefully to common words and we have worked on identifying their initial letters and syllables. We have also had a go at spelling words starting with vowels.

#### COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

Main Symptoms of COVID-19:

Less common Symptoms:

• Muscle pain, joint pain, diarrhoea, nausea, headache, vomiting, loss of appetite, fatigue, unexplained chest pain, conjunctivitis (eye infection)

#### Death Cap mushroom public health warning – information for staff, students and families

ACT Health has issued another public health warning about the dangers of Death Cap mushrooms, which are growing across the ACT. It has asked for schools to help raise awareness of this important public health issue. The key message is: Do not to touch, pick or eat any wild mushrooms.
