#### Welcome

A warm welcome to the start of term 3. We have an action packed term ahead of us. We hope that all our students and families had a well deserved break during the school holidays. This term we have a number of new families join our wonderful school. The school is aiming to hold a learning journey for parents to visit classrooms in week 10. The school is currently establishing a booking system to ensure we comply with covid safe practices keeping adult numbers in the classroom at a safe level. The students are looking forward to sharing their learning with you.

#### **Italian Program**

The three students from the University of Bergamo have settled in well to the school community and are working across our bilingual classrooms providing invaluable support to our teachers.

Last week I met with the President of the Dante Alighieri Society to discuss supports for the school. Starting next week, a new Italian Language Assistant will start at the school to support Italian learning at the school five days a week for the remainder of the year. A MoU has been established with Dante Alighieri Society and the Education Directorate to support this initiative. We look forward to continuing our positive relationship with the Dante Alighieri Society.

This week Maestra Lynden and I met with the new Education Support liason from the Italian Embassy. Her posting in Canberra is for 12 months. We took her on a tour of the school showing our bilingual program in action. We were also able to share suggestions on how the Italian Embassy could continue to support our bilingual program. Currently we have maestra Francesca for a six year period assisting our teachers in raising the Italian academic competence of our students.

#### **Athletics Carnival**

Our annual school athletics will proceed on Monday 8 August at Woden Park. We are very lucky to have the support of students from St Edmunds College who will assist us in running our track and field events. Parents are welcome to attend on the day and watch their students complete ensuring they are social distancing and practising covid safe practices.

#### **Day Trip Excursions**

Next week our Year 5/6 students will attend Birrigai on Monday and our Year 3/4 students will attend Birrigai on Thursday. Our students will travel to and from the venue via bus. We look forward to sharing their experiences via our facebook page and future newsletters.

#### **Assembly**

This week our Year 2 students hosted our fortnightly assembly. I was extremely impressed with the confidence of our Year 2 students as they announced each item in both Italian and English. It was a very polished performance. The students enjoyed watching Year 2 share their musical instruments they had made and the musical performance. Congratulations to all our award winners and our newly elected SRC representatives for semester 2.

#### **Pupil Free Days Term 3**

We expect these workforce pressures will continue through the colder months of the year.







#### **RAT TESTS**

The ACT Education Directorate will no longer be asking schools to distribute two RAT's per week to students. Instead from the commencement of term 2, week 9, RATS will be provided on an as needed basis for all students in ACT schools. Schools will hold a supply of RATS that can be sent home with students at the request of a parent/carer (2 per student) if required or can be collected from the Front Office between 8.30am to 3.30pm.

RAT tests will then be given to your child to bring home. If students are not attending school when requesting tests, or are subject to isolation or quarantine requirements, families can make alternative arrangements to collect RATs through a relative, neighbour or other student.
