Staffing





A message from the Minister for Education and Early Childhood Development



In the ACT there are 88 public schools, over 49,000 public school students and around 3,800 educators. But of course, I understand that for each of us as parents, the most important school is the school our children go to. That's why I want to make sure that every public school is a great school.

The ACT Government is upgrading and expanding public schools to make sure that learning environments are accessible and sustainable.

The government is committed to ensuring that every public school has the infrastructure to support high-quality education and that's why the government has been investing more than \$115 million to upgrade public schools right across the Territory.

Here at Yarralumla Primary School the government has delivered:

- Upgraded building access to ensure school is accommodating for everyone.
- Improved the heating, ventilation and cooling systems to enable better management of the temperature by preventing heat loss in winter and heat gain in summer. This improvement included window tinting, passive ventilation, shading and mechanical cooling.
- Upgraded classrooms and the Learning Support Unit ensuring students have access to a range of contemporary learning spaces. The classroom upgrades included Interactive White Boards, painting and lighting.
- Outdoor area work including a shade structure, shed, Joki hanging chair, water tank, sand and water table.

Every child and family has a place in ACT public schools regardless of their background or life circumstances. That's why this investment into public school infrastructure goes beyond just the basic things that allow learning and teaching to take place. The ACT Government invests in public schools to make sure that every student has what they need to be included, and to learn and develop their interests, passions and life skills.

The ACT Government has upgraded heating and cooling systems, reducing polluting emissions and making temperatures comfortable and conducive to learning in over 40 older public schools across Canberra.

The government has also purchased 3,300 Chromebooks to give to schools in February 2020 and upgraded classrooms, toilets, libraries, canteens and bike shelters, as well as gardens, landscaping and playground areas in schools to make sure that these spaces are positive and accommodating.

As Canberra grows, the government is making sure that schools grow with it. Every child has the right to access education and the ACT Government is making sure that this right is equally ensured for every young person.

SunSmart Program Turns 20 in ACT

It's hard to believe that Cancer Council's [National SunSmart Schools Program](#) was first introduced to ACT primary schools back in 1999 - 20 years ago. In 1999 year 2 students who were then Slip, Slop and Slapping are now turning 28 years old and many of them starting their own families with their children Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek and Sliding each day at school to reduce their personal risk of UV related skin damage and [skin cancer](#) later in life.

A recent research article (2019) in the **Health Promotion Journal Of Australia** titled: [The National SunSmart Schools Program - Impact on sun protection policies and practices in Australian primary schools](#) suggested that school SunSmart membership was associated with a significantly greater likelihood of several policies and practices being employed. The National SunSmart Schools Program continues to have a substantial impact in supporting the adoption of appropriate sun protection policies and their practical implementation across Australian primary schools.

To date the vast majority of ACT primary schools (over 90%) have been officially recognised for their SunSmart efforts and are members of the National SunSmart Schools Program.

This month Cancer Council ACT would like to personally acknowledge the following 14 ACT primary schools who were early adopters of the program and were awarded national SunSmart status in the first year the program was launched in Canberra back in 1999. These schools would have recently received a special SunSmart 20 Year Certificate and a letter of acknowledgement from Cancer Council ACT's CEO Sandra Turner.

Canberra Girls Grammar School's Eliza Coggan and Nicola Duncan have set up Plastic Free For Freyja, a small business that sells alternatives to plastic in two different sized packs (both named after the 2004 teen comedy) - the You Go Glen Coco expert pack and the So Fetch starter pack.

Each has a variety of plastic alternatives including bamboo coffee cups, reusable produce bags, string carry bags and even washable makeup wipes.

But not only do these packs go to help the planet, all profits going to local girl Freyja Christiansen who was diagnosed with clear cell sarcoma, a rare type of cancer, in 2017. The seven-year-old has been going through treatment ever since.

"We based the company around Freyja and we asked her what we wanted to do for her," Eliza says.

"Make-A-Wish contacted her and ask her what she wanted, and she didn't want to meet a Disney princess, she just wanted people to put away their rubbish, which is so great. So we wanted to help people stop making rubbish.

"Freyja's really professional and she knows all the stuff about the environment and she gave us so much advice."

It all started with a school assignment that required the two students to come up with a project that worked within the United Nations Sustainability Goals. Rather than produce a report for the class, Eliza and Nicola wanted to do something proactive.

And so the research began - not only into finding out what products most people would need to replace, but also finding ethical small businesses within Australia that could provide them.


