Dear families,

What a busy week we have had with our Athletics Carnival and 3/4 AquaSafe Program happening! On Monday, we loved seeing our students participating and trying their best at the Woden Athletics Park and also at school for our Junior students. Children displayed our Yarralumla STAR values at all times and showed their school spirit cheering loudly! Our school representatives for the South Weston Athletics Carnival have been notified and we wish them the best of luck next Tuesday. I was able to attend the AquaSafe Program today and enjoyed watching the students practise their strokes with laps up and down the pool, as well as enjoying wearing their life vests getting in and out of the dingy!

Next week, our school satisfaction survey opens. As part of our continuous effort to improve, the Education Directorate invites you to give feedback in an online survey about your experience of Yarralumla Primary School. Your responses will help us to identify what we do well and how we can improve. The data will also be used to underpin school improvement practices and inform government priorities, as well as in research projects and longitudinal studies aimed at improving the quality of education services in the ACT.

Last year, 60.3 % of parents responded with "I am satisfied that this school has high expectations". As a result we have focussed our professional learning and staff development on building positive relationships with all students to support learning. We see teachers use a range of strategies to understand where children are at with their learning and work through a range of strategies to move their learning forward. These strategies include but not limited to: observations, anecdotal reports, checklists, pre and post assessment tasks, student conferencing, collection of data and student reports. A core factor in this work is ensuring students have individual goals for their learning and that they can articulate these and show when they have mastered them.

Everyday our teachers are building their knowledge of where students are with their learning and the understanding of the Italian language. We are working closely as teaching staff to understand the data we are collecting and how it is used. Information is both formative to understand the where to next; and summative to gather evidence of what has been understood.

Our work in creating Visible Learners ensure that all lessons include a clear learning Intention and Success Criteria. We are currently working on ways for students to peer and self-assess their progress too.

As parents and carers, you will see differentiated, targeted learning in our classrooms with clear expectations and outcomes. You will see students working towards their individual learning goals and receiving feedback verbally and written by the classroom teachers.





Year 3/4 Newsletter

It's been a wonderful start to term 3 in the 3/4 cohort with lots of exciting learning and some special events that happen each year falling in the first half of the term.

In English, we have spent time writing to entertain with the focus being poetry. The children have created some fantastic haiku poems (three-line poems that are structured according to the number of syllables – five in the first line, seven in the second line and five again in the third line). These poems are a way of conveying meaning or an emotion about a subject in only a few words, so precise language choices can really create a big impact. We wrote on topics including pets, hobbies, animals and seasons, with some highly entertaining and absorbing finished products. Well done everyone!

In Mathematics, the times tables have been a recent focus for students. We had opportunities to explore a range of games to support our mental computation. Students self-selected a times table of their choice to use in some of these games, to help consolidate speed and accuracy in their work. These games are a lot of fun to play and also teach incredibly valuable mental computation skills at the same time.

A very physical start to the term has seen everyone participate in the Athletics Carnival, where a range of track and field events gave students a chance to participate and show off their skills. Aquasafe swimming lessons have also kept us busy recently. It has been wonderful to see students grow in ability and confidence as they challenge themselves to develop and refine water safety skills. Students have conducted themselves with distinction during the activities and showed impressive dedication to the task at hand.

In Italian the students started a project to describe and present a person they admire. The project called 'My Champion' offers the student the opportunity to bring in the classroom their passions and interests. When the information project is ready the students present to their class their choice with emphasis on why they chose that person. Here are some examples:

A message from the ACT Education Directorate: Keeping our students learning in Term 3

Every ACT public school is working hard to manage the impacts of COVID-19 and the flu in our schools to ensure minimal disruption for everyone and keep students learning.

Face-to-face learning in the classroom remains the core way students are learning this term; however, staff shortages may see them learning a little differently from time to time.

What can parents and students expect?

When schools do not have appropriate staffing levels to support students in their usual classrooms the following measures may be put in place:

- · Older students may learn online in a supervised setting.
- · Students may be engaged in a modified program of learning in their regular classroom with supervision from school staff.
- · Students may participate in self-directed learning (supervised by other classroom teachers this may be via Google Classrooms or a pre-prepared activity).
- · Students may be split into classes across the school, where children may engage in self-directed learning and/or the learning of their host class.
- · Some activities may be put on hold (eg lunchtime clubs)

Where schools are no longer able to manage using the above strategies students may move to learning from home for short periods of time.

If this is the case your school will work with the Directorate ahead of time to make this decision and families will be provided with learning activities for use during this time.

Sometimes this decision will need to be made quickly. We appreciate that the short notice is difficult for families and, where we can, will ensure we give as much notice as we are able.

Non-essential events and excursions

There may also be the need to postpone/cancel planned activities and events offsite (eg camps, excursions, sporting days etc) from time to time, sometimes at short notice.

We appreciate any cancellation is disappointing and wherever possible schools will reschedule these missed opportunities.

Thank you once more to our parents, carers and staff for their ongoing support and commitment again this term.



Cancer It's still cold, but August is 'Hats On' again for Canberra Schools.

With Spring just around the corner, Cancer Council ACT says it's important for Canberra schools, early childhood services and all outdoor workers to think ultra violet (UV) not heat, as we make our way into another hot summer, and remember to put 'hats on' when outdoors.

Whilst August is still a cold month in the nation's capital, ultraviolet radiation (UV) levels are on the rise to levels that warrant sensible sun protection, for at least part of the day.

The Cancer Council ACT message is pretty simple, when UV levels reach 3 and above, a combination of sun protection behaviour is required to protect against skin damage that can contribute to skin cancer later in life. The higher the UV level, the quicker unprotected skin can damage, sunburn or no sunburn.

Evidence suggests that childhood and adolescence sun exposure plays a significant factor in the development of skin cancer in later life. Therefore it's vital that Canberra schools and early childhood services implement and manage an effective sun protection policy when UV levels reach 3 and above.

Wearing sensible clothing and hats, making sunscreen accessible to students and teachers and taking advantage of shade, means children, students and teachers can significantly minimise their lifetime risk of developing skin cancer.

Every year over 12,000 Australians are diagnosed with melanoma skin cancer and approx. 2,200 Australians will die from skin cancer each year. The majority of skin cancers are preventable.

For each child in their family who attends an ACT public school, parents and carers will receive:

- An email about the parent survey, including a link to access the survey; and
- A letter about the student survey outlining the reasons for collection and privacy provision for the data.

If you do not receive the survey invitation, please check your Junk email folder; if it is not there, contact the school and you will be provided a survey link. If you do not have an email listed with the school, please contact the front office on 6142 3250.

The Parents and Carers Survey will be available online in other languages: Arabic, Burmese, Chinese, Hindi, Korean, Urdu, Vietnamese, Punjabi, Bengali, Spanish, Telugu, French and Italian. Respondents can select their preferred language when they start the survey. A shortened paper-version of the Parents and Carers Survey is also available in the following 5 languages: Dari, Dinka, Farsi, Karen and Mon.

For the results to reflect the opinions of our whole school community, we need as many parents and carers, staff and students as possible to complete the survey. 


