Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the final newsletter for term 1. Our students had a very engaging first ten weeks of school with camp, swimming carnivals, incursions and excursions as well as all the new learning in their year level. A huge thank you to the P&C for organising the community picnic last Friday, raising approximately \$2000. It was a wonderful opportunity to come together as a community and meet many of our new families. Thank you to the families and community stores who donated prizes for the raffle. The next P&C event will be the Mother's Day stall. We will be holding our cross country carnival in May and look forward to parents coming on site to cheer on the students as they run. St Edmunds College have kindly offered to support us with volunteers on the day.

School Holiday Programs

If you require care for your child during the school holidays you have a number of options. YWCA run programs from Majura Primary School, Turner Primary, Kingsford Smith School and Charles Conder Primary. Aeon Academy run their holiday program at YPS. Due to the building works including the replacement of the windows in the hall and corridor, Aeon Academy are relocating to the Gambari building. The Education Directorate have organised removalists to assist with the relocation this week. Aeon Academy will use all five classrooms, office and bathrooms within the Gambari building. 



Kristoff McK April 2023





Kindergarten Term 1 Week 10



Literacy - We have been setting some goals in our writing and working on challenging ourselves to make progress, including writing more than one sentence! We have been continuing onto our Unit 2 sounds and using this knowledge in our writing and reading. We have extended our knowledge of our sight words or camera words to use as well.

Maths – We have been continuing on with our addition and subtraction learning using concrete materials, as well as challenging ourselves to do some tricky questions in our heads, using the counting on strategy.

We are finishing up our exploration of data and graphs. Ask us about what we have learnt!



Italiano – Questa settimana, abbiamo imparato i nomi degli animali in italiano e abbiamo giocato a tombola!

SEL - We added being a good listener and being a good sport to our friendship toolbox. The children have practiced using all the tools with each other. This week they reflected on all their learning by putting 'ingredients' into a bowl to create a recipe for friendship!

Inquiry - We have continued to explore what we know about ourselves and our families, discussing that being different is great and makes our world so interesting! We can learn so much from other people because we all have different experiences to share.



Year One Learning Snapshots Term 1, weeks 9-10

In classes Corallo, Magenta, and Rossa, we are excited to have come to a happy and settled end to our first term of Year 1.

In the English classroom (Magenta and Corallo), we have been busy working on our reading. The students continue to make commendable gains in their ability to comprehend and use a variety of strategies when reading texts. These texts include 'big books' displayed on our interactive whiteboard from the Reading Eggs program and a range of interesting fiction and non-fiction books from our school library. The students have been involved in replenishing the collection of library books for our class 'Reading Den' by each choosing two books from the library to keep in our classroom. The students have also been exploring and practising a variety of reading strategies to help decipher tricky words and have chosen one to focus on as a personal goal. We have also learned how to do an 'overarm throw' in PE, studying the correct technique and practising it in a new favourite class game on the oval – 'Knights and Castles' (essentially a form of Dodgeball!).

In the Italian classroom we continue to read and write Italian words using the correct letters for sounds. We are listening and responding to questions about the weather, and we are beginning to use Italian vocabulary for feelings. We are practising the question and answer:

Q: Come ti senti? (How are you feeling?)

A: Mi sento... (I feel...)

Possible responses might be felice (happy), triste (sad), eccitato/a (excited), content/a (content), tranquillo/a (calm), emozionato/a (emotional, touched), arrabiato/a (angry), preoccupato/a (worried), scontroso/a (grumpy), timido/a (shy).

We are really looking forward to next term when the Italian home reading program will begin. Have a fabulous holiday!

My favourite thing in Term 1 was Maths. - Hunter F








5/6 NEWS

In Italian Maths, Ambra and Oro have been busy learning about the Cartesian Plane and how to recognise and plot coordinates. We have seen great effort and high quality work!










Zafferano have been fine tuning their creative scientist personas, finishing their amazing habitat dioramas for the most unique animals on earth. They present them to the other classes in week 10

COMMUNITY TRIP 2023 SCANZOROSCIATE/PEDRENGO, ITALY

Dear parents,

If you are interested in submitting an expression of interest in participating in the Community Trip 2023 to Scanzorosciate please do so. Your expressions of interest in participating in the Community Trip 2023 will be included on the spreadsheet which contains all your children's names and all your contact details.

Before we can progress with planning the Community Trip 2023 we need the Directorate of Education to authorise the trip and give us feedback on the billeting arrangements we propose. Secondly, the School Board must authorise the Community Trip 2023, as well.

Priority to participate in the Community Trip will be given to students in Years 6 and 5. These students are given priority as it is the last opportunity for Year 6 students to attend, and if there is not to be a Community Trip 2024, it is the last opportunity for our Year 5 students to participate.

Once the Community Trip 2023 has been authorised there will be regular meetings held throughout Terms 2 and 3. The first meeting will be held Week 1 of Term 2 on Wednesday, 26 April 2023 in the Staff Room from 4:30pm – 5:30pm. If you are interested, but have not decided yet, you are very welcome to attend this meeting.

I will discuss all aspects of the Community Trip with parents and carers travelling to Scanzorosciate. The Directorate has processes and procedures that we must follow and a fair amount of paperwork to be completed. The documents you receive will outline the purpose of the trip, students' health issues and medications, food allergies, permission for billeting, permission for student activities, fees for the canteen at schools, etc. This documentation will provide more detail regarding the trip.

Historically, the trip is biannual, but due to COVID-19 we haven't been since 2018. We were beginning to plan the trip for 2020 in late 2019 but it was cancelled early 2020.

The participating children attend school for a week. They are with a billet family (if approved by the Directorate) who has a child the same age as your child and attends school in the same class with the billet child.

I usually advise that children in Years 3-6 participate. This is for a few reasons, any time before Year 3 the children don't have enough Italian to attend school without feeling lost and overwhelmed. Also, due to their young age, they may find living with a family they don't know and doesn't speak any English distressing and confusing. I strongly suggest that you speak to your child's classroom teacher regarding your child's level of Italian if they are in a class below Year 3.

Parents accompanying their children stay in local hotels, meet their children outside the school in the mornings with the billeting family and are within walking distance of the billeting family. Often the parents meet the billeting family after school or are invited to dinner. All participating parents often organise tourist outings/events through the days.

The main benefit for our students participating in this visit is to give them an experience in an Italian classroom. Our students cope well in class and are surprised to find they understand and speak more Italian than they realised. It demonstrates to them that all their hard work in a bilingual environment does have tangible benefits. They return to school feeling proud of themselves and proud of their experiences in Italy. The billeting families are very caring, as is the Italian way, and our students are spoilt with good food, lots of care and attention, not to mention a lot of gelato.
